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Dear Parents,

Congratulations! Your child has decided to be a member of the Schmucker Middle School Instrumental Music Program. Schmucker Bands and Orchestras have a tradition of excellence and we are proud of the students' achievements. There are many aspects of the program that you may be curious about as an instrumental music parent. We hope to answer your questions with the following information.

Instrumental Music Objectives

The students should be able to:

- 1. Follow classroom rehearsal procedures and respect the property of others.
- 2. Meet individual responsibilities for care and preventive maintenance of a musical instrument.
- 3. Follow concert procedures and meet performance obligations on the school calendar.
- 4. Demonstrate mastery of musical skills and concepts outlined in the Indiana State Standards.
- 5. Read and perform appropriate grade level musical literature.
- 6. Sight-read appropriate grade level music.

Lockers

SMS does not have lockers for all instruments. Some instruments will be placed in a storage room on shelves. The room will be locked unless we are present. Everyone else will receive a locker. Combinations lock are permitted as long as we have the combination as well. **EVERY instrument must have a name tag with first and last name.** Please have the serial number for your child's instrument in a secure place.

Classroom Rehearsal Procedures

The students will:

- 1. Arrive to class on time, listen, and be respectful of others.
- 2. Be prepared for class with working instrument, music, pencil and 3 ring binder.
- 3. Never handle an instrument that does not belong to you.
- 4. Bring a note to the director from a parent if he/she can not play because of illness, injury, or dental work. An alternate assignment will be given to those students who are not able to play.
- 5. Raise hand to be recognized to ask a question and not talk when others are talking

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Practice Expectations

There are no shortcuts in the development of young musicians. Dedication and commitment are the key building blocks of a successful student. Concepts that are discussed and taught in the classroom must be practiced by the individual at home in order for them to be mastered. It is important for students to establish a practice routine. Goal Sheets are due every Monday with a parent signature.

- 1. Average 15 minutes a day, 100 minutes total for the week.
- 2. Spread out your practice time. Avoid practicing 100 minutes in one day.
- 3. Student should have a practice goal in mind before they begin to play.

MONDAY – Goal Sheets are due for full credit

TUESDAY – Students can turn goal sheet in with 25% point deduction

WEDNESDAY – Students can turn goal sheet with 50% point deduction

THURSDAY and FRIDAY – goal sheets will not be counted for a grade

Concert Attire

Boys: Black dress pants, white shirt with a collar, black socks and black dress shoes.

Girls: Black pant, capri's or gauchos, white shirt and black dress shoes. In order to keep a uniform look, no skirts or dresses are allowed.
